PROPOSAL FOR SERVICES

Treemore Ecology and Land Services is pleased to provide this proposal for land conservation consulting services to the Bridgewater Township Board of Trustees.

Proposal: Establish a database of the owners of undeveloped agricultural and natural area properties in Bridgewater Township and prioritize those properties. The prioritization would utilize maps of priority properties produced by Washtenaw County Parks as well as personal knowledge of township lands. The database will be in Microsoft Excel software and would be the property of the township.

After reviewing with members of the Township Board of Trustees and the Farmland Preservation Board, I would contact high priority owners to discuss land preservation information by mail, phone and personal meetings.

Tasks and Estimated Costs:

database creation and prioritization: 20 hours

preparing and sending a mailing: 5 hours contacting landowners by phone: 5 hours

personal meetings with 10 landowners: 20 hours

total of above: 50 hours

For new and emerging programs, my rate is \$60/hour =\$3,000

Background: A landowner's decision to participate in a program that ensures his or her property will remain in its present state is not taken lightly. A few landowners know what they want to do and will proceed to nominate their property. For most, however, much time, discussion and thought goes into their decision. It may be years until they are ready to pursue land preservation.

Some landowners may attend a public open house like the successful one held at the township hall in March, 2018; others need a more direct contact. In either case, followup to discuss any questions that have arisen is essential to nurture interest. The most effective means of transmitting information is through a personal visit and conversation with a knowledgeable person. This allows for an accurate description of land preservation basics and may also establish a relationship of trust that ideally develops over years.

The Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners recently approved a proposal from the county parks department to create a \$7.5 million special revenue fund for the purpose of covering the costs of maintaining lands purchased through the Natural Area Preservation Program (NAPP) and monitoring conservation easements. With that action, approximately \$13 million remains for additional acquisitions of land and easements in the next three years. Landowner awareness is low and the number of applications submitted is small. There is an outstanding opportunity to add more protected properties in Bridgewater Township at little or no cost by providing accurate information to landowners, followed by discussion and assistance in applying.

With 27 years of experience, 100 projects completed and over 7,000 acres of land in Washtenaw County protected, I've found that the way to build understanding and trust with landowners is to first send a letter asking for a meeting, follow up with a phone call, and, if the person is interested, to then meet in person. At these meetings I would present options on selling and donating land and conservation easements (permanent deed restrictions), answer questions and address individual concerns.

As shown in the county priority maps, Bridgewater Township is home to some of the best remaining agricultural and natural lands in Washtenaw County. I propose to work with you toward protecting those lands.

The report shows specific information, with comparison to previous years, for time spent by position, traffic enforcement, total calls for service (including MSP), and deputies under contract from other jurisdictions responding into Bridgewater Township.

In Summary, Bridgewater Township had 35 calls for service for the month of August. Of the 35 calls the Michigan State Police responded to 15. The Sheriff Office responded to 1 call, 19 calls were administratively cleared this month with no police response. In general these calls are typically: BOL's (Be on the Lookout), ambulance requests transferred to Huron Valley Ambulance, cancelation of call due to other resolution, example, alarm company cancels due to home owner request.



County Wide Patrol: County funded county wide road patrol deputies who primarily perform law enforcement duties in non-contracting areas.



Command: Road patrol sergeants who supervise the above staff. Manages on duty staffing and coordinated on scene police response.



The Township is in receipt of your letter dated August 23, 2018 and offers the following response:

Although the Township's expenses have exceeded revenues over the past few fiscal years, the Board does not see this as an immediate cause for alarm due to the size of the current fund balance (\$450,511 as of 3/31/18), nor is this anticipated to be the case in future years. If this did become a trend, and the Township did overspend every year, the current fund balance would take nearly 38 years to expend if the annual expenditures in excess of revenue was equal to the average of the past three years.

It is important to note that for fiscal year 2018 the Township had a public works road improvement project (culvert replacement) that caused the Township to dip into their General Fund reserves to cover the cost of the project. Had it not been for this added expense the Township's revenues would have exceeded expenses. The Township considers their General Fund reserves as a rainy-day fund for these purposes.

In addition, for fiscal year 2017 there was an error in the billing for contracted fire emergency services causing the Township to expend additional funds in the 2017 fiscal year for service charges incurred in the 2016 fiscal year. Had it not been for

this billing error revenues would have exceeded expenses.

We hope our response satisfies your request in this matter. Please don't hesitate to contact me or our auditors if you have any further questions or concerns.

On motion of plaintiff, Bridgewater Township, by its attorney Frederick Lucas for summary disposition, the Court having considered the matter:

IT IS ORDERED AND ADJUDGED AS FOLLOWS:

Defendant is in violation of Bridgewater Township's Storage and Disposal 1. of Junk Ordinance (the Junk Ordinance) by permitting a public nuisance to exist on his property located at 12460 East Michigan Ave, Clinton, MI which is located in the Township (hereafter "Property") and more particularly described as follows:

Land situated in the Township of Bridgewater, County of Washtenaw, State of Michigan, to-wit:

All that part of the North 'A of the Southeast 1/4 lying Northerly of U.S. Highway 12, Section 25, T4S, R4E, Bridgewater Township, Washtenaw County, Michigan.

Parcel No.: Q -17-25-400-001

- 2. Within 14 days of the date of entry of this default judgment, defendant shall abate the nuisance by removing from the Property all refuse, waste and junk which has accumulated on the Property or by placing all such materials in a fully enclosed building or refuse container. (See attacked)
- 3. Defendant shall thereafter be permanently enjoined from violating the Township's Junk Ordinance.
- 4. If defendant fails to abate the nuisance by removing from his Property or placing in fully enclosed building or refuse container all refuse, waste and junk within the time permitted, the Township may enter onto Property and clean up any refuse, waste and junk located on the Property, by removing and disposing of any materials that are in violation of the Township's Blight Ordinance.
- 5. Defendant shall reimburse the Township for its filing fees and service fees in the amount of \$253.70 and pay the Township its actual attorney fees in the amount of \$1,867.50 for bringing this action.
- 6. If defendant fails to comply with this judgment within the time permitted and the Township enters onto the property to remove any materials remaining thereon in violation of the Junk ordinance, defendant shall pay to the Township all costs incurred by the Township for the removal of all debris and other items being stored on the Property in violation of the Junk Ordinance.

- 7. Should defendant fail to pay the Township within seven (7) days of being billed by the Township for the cost of cleaning up the Property and its attorney fees and costs, all such costs may be assessed against the Property and placed on the tax roll.
- 8. Further, the Township shall have a lien of all of real property located in Michigan owed by defendant, by recording a copy of this Judgment with the register of deeds, to secure the payment of all amounts owed to the Township.

If you are looking for a good comparison of costs for a possible Hogan Road culvert project, the costs will be highly dependent upon MDEQ requirements. The first step of the design will be a meeting with MDEQ to understand the requirements of the specific location. That will dictate the design and type of structure that will be used for replacement. If we can use a CMP and the work can be performed by our crews then the cost will be much less than if we are required to put in a concrete box culvert installed by a contractor. As a project partner on the Hogan Road culvert project, if the Township decides to move forward, we are committed to keeping these costs as low as possible.





Right-of-Way Grading

In cultivated areas, the topsoil along the right-of-way is stripped by bulldozer and stored in piles for careful replacement later.

Stringing Pipe

Crews re-stake the final route of the pipeline and lay out or "string" sections of the pipe in a single line within the right-of-way.

Bending Pipe

Crews bend the pipe to follow the contours of the land and weld the pipe sections together.

6 Line-Up, Initial Weld

These pipes are already coated to prevent corrosion. The integrity of the weld is inspected, and the weld joint is coated.

Soil Separation

In agricultural areas, careful attention is paid to properly separating and storing the topsoil and subsoil so they do not mix.

Final Coating and Inspection

The pipe coating is inspected one more time.

Lowering Pipe into Trench

The pipe is surveyed and laid within prepared trench bottom.

Backfill and Rough Grade

The trench is then backfilled with subsoil (and separated topsoil).

Testing Final Tie-In

Before operation, water is used to test the pressure of the line and ensure the structural integrity of the pipe and welds.

Final Clean-Up and Restoration

Final grading is performed and topsoil is spread over work area. Right-of-way is restored to pre-construction contours and reseeded with native species.

Zoning Administrator Report

September 2018

During this month, the following applications were received, reviewed, and acted upon. Also included is a summary of ordinance enforcement and administration activities, and additional information:

Zoning Compliance Certificates and Administrative Site Plan Approval:

1. **Zoning Compliance Certificate** – **Kohlmescher** (21675 Willow Rd., Manchester). Application for zoning approval for a new four-foot high fence along the east property line. Approved 9/25/2018.

Ordinance Enforcement:

- 2. **12460 E. Michigan Ave., Clinton (Samuels) outdoor storage of junk.** During my last site inspection in September (on 9/25/2018), I found Dr. Samuels there with a friend loading a 26-foot U-Haul truck with materials from the property. Although there was some improvement from my previous visits, I estimated in my follow up email to the Twp. Attorney that the clean-up project was still less than 30% complete. Photographs showing the state of the property were also forwarded to the Twp. Attorney at his request, in anticipation of a 9/26/2018 court date. As noted in the Board packet, a summary judgment has been issued giving Dr. Samuels 14 calendar days to complete the clean-up.
- 3. **11840 Hogan Rd. complaint about excessive barking of kennel dogs.** On 9/19/2018, I received a new complaint from a neighbor regarding barking noise from the dogs in the kennel. During follow up visits, I did not hear any barking noise at all from the property, but I am continuing to check the property periodically for compliance with the kennel standards.
- 4. **12727 Hogan Rd. structures constructed without a zoning permit.** The owner has applied for an "after-the-fact" variance for the two (2) agricultural buildings to shelter horses constructed without the required zoning permit and in violation of Section 5.108 (which requires these large animal shelters to be located to the rear of any dwelling on the property and a minimum of 50-feet from lot boundaries). A Zoning Board of Appeals hearing is scheduled for 10/8/2018 at 6:30pm, with the regular Planning Commission meeting to follow.

Ordinance Administration and Other Items of Interest:

5. **Telephone calls, emails, and meetings.** I received telephone calls from property owners, real estate agents, and an appraiser seeking information regarding zoning districts for individual parcels, zoning requirements for pole barn and agricultural building construction, and allowable uses and dimensional standards for lots in the AG (General Agriculture) zoning district.
