Bridgewater Township Private Road Procedures

Where Do I Get Application Forms?

Application forms are available on the Township's website at <u>www.twp-bridgewater.org</u> and from the Township Clerk or Zoning Administrator.

When Do I Apply?

At least twenty one (21) days prior to a regularly scheduled meeting of the Planning Commission.

What Types of Developments Permit Construction of a Private Road?

Private roads are permitted only within:

- Single-family cluster developments in accordance with Sections 1101 and 1447 of the Bridgewater Township Zoning Ordinance.
- Multiple Family Residential developments.
- Mobile Home Parks.

What Do I Submit?

- Fifteen (15) copies of the completed application form must be submitted to the Township Clerk
- Fifteen (15) copies of required site plan and engineering plans for private road.
- Fifteen (15) copies of required Private Road Maintenance Agreement.
- Verification of approval of Washtenaw County Road Commission for design of proposed intersection(s) with County road(s).
- Legal Description of subject property, private road easement, all resulting parcels, and drain / utility easements.
- Ten (10) year ownership history of parent parcel.
- Required fee as established by the Township Board.

Note: Incomplete or inaccurate submittal may result in significant delay.

Do I Need To Attend Any Meetings?

The Planning Commission and Township Board will conduct meetings at which your request will be considered. While you are not personally *required* to be in attendance, it is strongly recommended that you have representation at all meetings at which your request will be discussed. You will be notified of all meetings.

NOTE: The Planning Commission and Township Board may take action on your request whether you are in attendance or not.

Does An Approved Private Road Site Plan Allow Me To Begin Construction?

No. Approval does not authorize construction. If your Private Road site plan is approved, construction plan review and permits may be required prior to construction.

How Much Does The Review Process Cost?

Attached to this application is a fee schedule which outlines review costs.

What	Needs To Be Included In The Private Road Maintenance Agreement?			
The F	ollowing list highlights the basic required content of Private Road Maintenance Agreements:			
	Legal Description - legal description of parent parcel, resultant parcels, private road easement, utility easements.			
	Private Road Association - Creation of Private Road Association, Membership, Voting rights, Election of officers.			
	Annual Meeting - Annual meeting required. Purpose - Elect officers, approve maintenance program and budget for next year.			
	Assessment - Annual assessment required, proportional to share of budget, based on number of parcels owned.			
	Assessment Collection - How assessments will be collected, treasurer responsible, due dates, where funds will be deposited.			
	Failure To Pay Assessment - Recourse(s) available to Association if landowner fails to pay, liens suits, collection costs.			
	Road and Utility Easement - Easement for road and utilities, access assured to owners, public, utilities and the Township.			
	Estimate Of Expenses - Estimates required yearly for maintenance of road, Association responsible for securing estimates for grading, drainage, snow removal and base / surface repair.			
	Extraordinary Repairs - Unanticipated repairs, method of assessment collection, Association empowered to take immediate steps to repair.			
	Notice to Township - Association required to notify Township yearly with Association contact, agenda and minutes for annual meeting, proposed and approved maintenance budgets.			
	Maintenance and Repair Work - Association Chair responsible to schedule maintenance, bills paid by treasurer, all work to be in conformance with Township-Approved plans dated			
	and Bridgewater Township Private Road Ordinance, Township Case # Township and County Road Commission NOT responsible for maintenance of private roads.
